<b>October 3, 2007</b>	Last day to withdraw from fall semester courses without academic consequences (i.e. without receiving a grade). Courses dropped after this date will be recorded on the academic transcript with a grade of 'W' to indicate withdrawal. <sup>1</sup>  Last day to drop courses and receive a 50 percent refund of tuition fees, fall semester <sup>1</sup>
<b>October 8, 2007</b>	Thanksgiving Day, no lectures
<b>October 15, 2007</b>	Classes for P/J and I/S consecutive education students
<b>October 16 - November 2, 2007</b>	Field Experience Practicum I for P/J and I/S consecutive education students
<b>November 13, 2007</b>	Last day to withdraw from fall semester courses. <sup>1</sup> As of November 14, 2007 students may not drop courses or withdraw. Active fall semester courses will be graded by instructors.
<b>November 26 - December 14, 2007</b>	Field Experience Practicum II for P/J and I/S consecutive education students
<b>December 5, 2007</b>	Last day of lectures, fall semester

<b>December 7 - 18, 2007</b>	Fall semester final examination period. Students are advised not to make commitments during this period (i.e. vacation, travel plans).
<b>January 7, 2008</b>	Lectures begin, winter semester Deadline for payment of fees, winter semester
<b>January 18, 2008</b>	End of regular registration period; last day to add courses, winter semester <sup>1</sup> Last day to drop courses and receive a 100 percent refund of tuition fees, winter semester <sup>1</sup>
<b>February 1, 2008</b>	Last day to withdraw from winter semester courses without academic consequences (i.e. without receiving a grade). Courses dropped after this date will be recorded on the academic transcript with a grade of 'W' to indicate withdrawal. <sup>1</sup> Last day to drop courses and receive a 50 percent refund of tuition fees, winter semester <sup>1</sup>
<b>February 4, 2008</b>	Last day to submit online application for graduation for the spring session of Convocation
<b>February 18 - 22, 2008</b>	Midterm break
<b>March 20, 2008</b>	Last day to withdraw from winter semester courses. As of March 21, students may not drop courses or withdraw. Active winter semester courses will be graded by instructors. Lectures end for both P/J and I/S consecutive education students, winter semester
<b>March 21, 2008</b>	Good Friday, no lectures
<b>March 25 - May 2, 2008</b>	Field Experience Practicum III for both P/J and I/S consecutive education students
<b>April 11, 2008</b>	Lectures end, winter semester
<b>April 14 - 24, 2008</b>	Winter semester final examination period. Students are advised not to make commitments during this period (i.e. vacation, travel plans).
<b>April 28 - May 9, 2008</b>	Field experience practicum for first-year concurrent education students
<b>April 28 - May 16, 2008</b>	Field experience practicum for second-year concurrent education students
<b>April 28 - May 23, 2008</b>	Field experience practicum for third-year concurrent education students
<b>May 5 &amp; 6, 2008</b>	Culminating days for both P/J and I/S consecutive education students
<b>May 5, 2008</b>	Lectures begin, summer semester, (including 14-week summer semester and seven-week spring session) Deadline for payment of fees, summer semester
<b>May 9, 2008</b>	Last day to drop seven-week spring session courses and receive a 100 percent refund of tuition fees <sup>1</sup>

**May 16, 2008**

Last day to add course, 14-week summer semester<sup>1</sup>

Last day to drop 14-week summer semester courses and receive a 100 percent refund of tuition fees<sup>1</sup>

Last day to withdraw from seven-week spring session courses without academic consequences (i.e. without receiving a grade). Courses dropped after this date will be recorded on the academic transcript with a grade of 'W' to indicate withdrawal.<sup>1</sup>

Last day to drop a seven-week spring session course and receive a 50 percent refund of tuition fees<sup>1</sup>

**May 19, 2008**

Victoria Day, no lectures

**June 2, 2008**

Last day to withdraw from 14-week summer semester courses without academic consequences (i.e. without receiving a grade). Courses dropped after this date will be recorded on the academic transcript with a grade of 'W' to indicate withdrawal.<sup>1</sup>

Last day to drop a 14-week summer courses and receive a 50 percent refund of tuition fees

**June 6, 2008**

Spring Convocation

**June 9, 2008**

Last day to withdraw from seven-week spring session courses.<sup>1</sup> As of June 10, students may not withdraw, or drop seven-week spring session courses. Active seven-week spring session courses will be graded by instructors.

**June 18, 2008**

Lectures end, seven-week spring session

**June 19 – 22, 2008**

Spring session final examination period (four days). Students are advised not to make commitments during this period.

**June 23 – 27, 2008**

Midterm break, 14-week summer semester

**June 30, 2008**

Lectures begin, seven-week summer session  
Lectures resume, 14 week summer semester

**July 1, 2008**

Canada Day, no lectures

**July 7, 2008**

Last day to add courses, seven-week summer session<sup>1</sup>

Last day to drop seven-week summer session courses and receive a 100 percent refund of tuition fees<sup>1</sup>

**July 14, 2008**

Last day to withdraw from seven-week summer session courses without academic consequences (i.e. without receiving a grade). Courses dropped after this date will be recorded on the academic transcript with a grade of 'W' to indicate withdrawal.<sup>1</sup>

Last day to drop seven-week summer session courses and receive a 50 percent refund of tuition fees<sup>1</sup>

**July 22, 2008**

Last day to withdraw from 14-week summer semester courses. As of July 23 students may not withdraw or drop 14-week summer semester course. Active 14-week summer semester courses will be graded by instructors.

<b>August 1, 2008</b>	Last day to withdraw from seven-week summer session courses. As of August 2, students may not withdraw, or drop seven-week summer session courses. Active seven-week summer session courses will be graded by instructors.
<b>August 4, 2008</b>	Civic Holiday, no lectures
<b>August 14, 2008</b>	Lectures end 14-week summer semester and seven-week summer session
<b>August 15 – 18, 2008</b>	Summer semester final examination period (includes seven-week and 14-week courses). Period spans four days inclusive. Students are advised not to make commitments during this period.

<sup>1</sup>Courses offered outside the normal teaching timeframe will have add/drop deadlines prorated accordingly. In such cases, faculties will advise students of appropriate deadline dates during the first meeting of the class.
