Graduate will be prepared to analyze complex problems of practices and use collaborative skills to develop innovative solutions to community issues.

Fields

Digital education and online pedagogy:

Explores how digital technologies are reshaping teaching and learning, with a focus on online environments. Study critical issues in education in the digital age, strategies for teaching in an online world, and the role of leadership and technology in shaping digital learning experiences.

Educational leadership and professional practice:

Develop strategies for effective and ethical leadership within educational contexts. Emphasizes strategic thinking, reflective practice, and technological fluency.

Social contexts and wellbeing in education:

Study how social, cultural, and emotional dynamics affect educational experiences and outcomes. Dive deeper into topics such as Mental Health and Wellbeing in the Digital Age, the influence of Youth, Media and Popular Culture, and the Social and Cultural Context of Education.

Research and inquiry in education:

Work on building research literacy and methodological competence. and engage critically with educational data and scholarship. Grounded in Research Perspectives and Methods, your work will introduce both qualitative and quantitative approaches to educational inquiry.
